

0% Increase

Owing to the hard work of Parish Council staff and Councillors I am as pleased as punch to announce that the Parish Council is NOT increasing the parish precept. This means your bill will remain the same for Parish Services.

The Parish staff spend many more hours than they are paid for, working on your behalf. The Parish Councillors give their skills, time and efforts free. From Cllr Grimes's spreadsheets, Cllr John Barber's financial expertise to Cllr Peter Thirwall's project management, ALL the Councillors of the Parish are very generous with their time. This means we are managing to provide all of the services which you have become used to, plus some new projects in the coming years.

This year we look forward to holding our Gala on 24th June, 2017. Like the Light Switch On, the Gala continues to grow in popularity and both seem to bring a little happiness to us all.

The Environment Committee have negotiated space on the Tanyard to store salt, thus saving the handyman hours of time and physical effort barrowing salt from the community centre. This will release them to start other work, such as really cleaning out the kerbside gullies, removing weeds and detritus, plus work on refurbishing benches and improving the flowerbeds at Wood Lane and at the side of the underpass.

The Recreation Committee have plans to improve the tiling in the showers at Bob Mason changing rooms, as well as improvement to Wickersley Park. Money has also been earmarked for increasing the holiday programme which provides a variety of activities in the summer for our teenagers.

The Woodland Committee is looking forward to implementing the Wickersley Wood plan which was drawn up last year after consultation. I especially look forward to seeing the new sculptures in the wood which will herald the start of the sculpture trail, this will be added to over the coming years.

Last year we bought and opened Winthrop Gardens. We learnt a great deal and now know the challenges we face and some of the solutions. It has become apparent, however, that we need extra resources to get the gardens and café to their full potential, so we have budgeted for extra help with caretaking, cleaning and organisational help. This will support the volunteers who are a happy and dedicated group who provide a Warm Winthrop Welcome to all visitors. So if you can spare a few hours to help in the gardens or café just give us a ring on 01709 703270.

The work of the Parish can only be done with your support. I hope you look forward to all the improvements and events which the Parish provides with great enthusiasm.

If you have any comments on this year's budgets, or on any other parish matters, I will be only too pleased to discuss them at my monthly surgeries on the first Saturday of the month at Wickersley Community Centre between 10 am and 11 am.

Tanyard Toilets - For Your Convenience

At a time when public services are being cut, Wickersley Parish Council is immensely proud to still be able to provide free public toilets for our Parishioners.

According to research, over the past decade a staggering 1782 public toilets have closed. In a city as big as Newcastle, home to nearly 300,000 people there are now no council-run public toilets.

Many large Metropolitan Councils have outsourced their public toilets to private companies, with some charging as much as 50p for entry.

Wickersley Parish Council recognise the need to provide toilets for the public and local businesses, who we believe would lose trade without them.

We know how, at times, public toilets can be a lifeline to some people wishing to go to the local shops and to get out and about in the community. Especially, older people, disabled people, and families with children.

Over the past thirty years or so the lease for the toilets has been held by the Borough Council, albeit they have been run and paid for by Wickersley Parish Council.

As I am sure you will all have noticed, the condition of the toilets was pretty poor and because we did not hold the lease we have been reluctant to spend the substantial amount of money needed to refurbish them.

However last year we managed to get the lease transferred to the Parish Council and so we have been able to undertake the refurbishments.

The refurbished toilets will now consist of a woman's toilet and a slightly larger men's toilet with urinal. Although the men's toilet cannot officially be designated as a 'Disabled Toilet' it does have a wide outward opening door with more room to manoeuvre a wheelchair and can therefore be used by the disabled, which is a great improvement on the old toilets.

At the same time we have been able to provide better facilities for our hardworking handymen.

I would like to thank The Chair of the Environment Committee, Councillor Pat Beighton and her trusty helper, Councillor Chris Grimes for setting the ball rolling on the project before handing over to me to do the design and procurement.

I would also like to thank the contractor, Sanderson Building Services for the sterling work they have done on the refurbishments.

The toilets will be open Monday to Saturday from 7.30 am to 5.00 pm and closed on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

I do hope everyone is pleased with the finished job and we can keep the toilets in good condition and free of vandalism.

Wickersley Walks with the Parish Council

We are so fortunate living in Wickersley, being surrounded by accessible and lovely open countryside. Whichever way you decide to head out on foot, within a short distance you are in green belt with plenty of foot paths and quiet lanes to explore. It may not be as dramatic as the Yorkshire Dales, Wolds or Moors however, it still has its own charm and lots of hidden gems.

The Parish council have organised guided walks from the community centre for the past 3 years and the dates for this year's walks are:
21st May, 25th June, 30th July and 20th August.

The walks are led by experienced and knowledgeable walkers and aimed at manageable distances for all ages. WICKERSLEY WOODS

Wickersley Woods and The Gorse are managed by Wickersley Parish Council Woodland Committee on behalf of its Parishioners. Both the Woods and the Gorse are each managed in accordance with five year management plan, which have been subject to public consultation before their implementation. The Parish Council contracts a specialist woodland expert to help with the preparation of the plans and ongoing implementation and maintenance of the woods.

Typically, the implementation of the plans and ongoing maintenance work includes:

- Clearing of the glade.
- Thinning of the trees to allow light penetration into the woods.
- Trying to control the bracken and Himalayan balsam.
- Repairs to paths and bridges.
- Pruning of dangerous and diseased trees.
- Provision of benches and nesting boxes.
- Obtaining grants.

etc., etc.

All the above is self-explanatory, however in addition we carry out a system of selective coppicing (cutting down of trees) in sections over many years. This work is usually on the western edge of the woods running parallel to Woodside Court.

Understandably, some members of the public are unaware of the reasoning for such work.

Coppicing is a traditional form of woodland management that provides an attractive woodland structure for wildlife, particularly birds that use dense shrubbery in woodland. Wickersley Wood has limited habitat like this and the coppicing work will help improve this type of habitat.

Should any member of the public wish to learn more about the work of the Woodland Committee they are very welcome to attend its meeting. Details of the dates and agendas for the meetings can be found on the Councils website. Alternatively the management plans can be found on-line or a copy will be made available in the Library.


